This morning, we welcome to the pulpit Ruth Azar, Director of the Second Mile Center of Detroit. Ms. Azar is the first born American child from parents of Syria and Lebanon. Ruth's five older siblings were born in Tripoli, Lebanon; her two younger siblings were born in America. Ruth grew up on the East Side of Detroit until middle school. After her family moved, she graduated from Grosse Pointe North High School. While working at a CPA firm in downtown, Ruth attended college. She enjoyed a successful career in public accounting, having her own practice for over thirty years in forensic accounting. Ruth is an Elder, under the care of Grosse Pointe Memorial Church, and is in the lay pastor program at Maumee Valley Presbytery and the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary. Currently, she is doing her internship at South Lyon Presbyterian Church. As a child Ruth wanted ten children, and in addition to her daughter Angelique and her son Dylan, she has raised six other children.

In Spring of 2005, God spoke to Ruth when she was in Mexali, Mexico, on a mission trip. The single word she heard was "follow." By the end of 2005, God's plan was revealed to her, and following that plan, in February, 2007, she opened the Second Mile Center. As founder of the center, Ruth serves as the visionary and executive director. Ruth joyfully serves the Lord and God's beloved children. God granted her wish, and she now has more than 200 children under her care.

Second Mile Center of Detroit is a non-profit organization serving underprivileged children, youth and adults in a neighborhood highly concentrated with blight, crime and poverty. The Center gives a message of hope, shares the love of Christ and builds relationships through a variety of no-cost programs and services, including after-school programs with dinners, summer day camp, community dinners, clothing and food pantry, annual health fair, computer lab, sign mime worship lessons, step dance lessons, life skills, arts, recreation and field trips. The center is a safe haven for the community and continues to expand its services and outreach.
