David Wagner holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Michigan where he studied with Marilyn Mason. In addition to his work as a solo performer, Dr. Wagner has also been organist and harpsichordist with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. He is the recipient of the Palmer Christian award from the University of Michigan School of Music, for postdoctoral achievement in the field of music performance, and the Arts Achievement Award from Wayne State University.

As a church musician, Dr. Wagner has distinguished himself working with both professional and volunteer ensembles in the Archdiocese of Detroit. He has been the conductor of the General Motors Employees Chorus and currently is the conductor of the Madonna University Chorale, and has toured with this group in Europe and the United States. The Chorale has been invited to sing at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and Washington National Cathedral in our nation's capital, Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris, St. Anne's Cathedral in Dublin, and Galway Cathedral in Galway.

As a classical music broadcaster, he has a national reputation and is Program Director and Morning host of WRCJ-FM in Detroit. Other stations include WQRS in Detroit, WGUC in Cincinnati, WTMI in Miami, WFLN in Philadelphia, KMZT in Los Angeles, Classical Public Radio Network and National Public Radio. His book, *The Complete Listeners Guide to Classical Music* has been published by Schirmer Trade Books.
